Leoshina in her position as Miss PNG presented Wenceslaus Magun K1000.00 towards the preservation of the endangered leather back turtle.



NEW CANOPY CRANE FOR BIRDWATCHING

Professor Vojtech Novotny, who works for the New Guinea Binatang Research Centre, said that the new Kakoba Canopy Crane could be used to take tourists high above the rainforests to see birds and other animals.

Professor Novotny was speaking at the opening of the new facility at Baitabag Village in Madang on the 5th of December.

Professor Novotny said that apart from attracting tourists, scientists from all over the world could now have access to the rainforest's canopy in Madang.

"The crane will be used by PNG and overseas scientists to reach the forest's canopy for various observations and experiments on the forest ecology," he said.

Dinesh Papapu represented MTS at the ceremony and was excited about this additional activity that would help in attracting tourism to the Province and serve to assist in educating the people about the preservation of our environment and ecology. Dinesh said that the facility would be promoted by MTS to become a major attraction in Madang.

Professor Novotny added that the local villagers in Baitabag could also benefit from ecotourism.

"Now that this facility has been built in their forest, tourists would come to their village, this would create jobs for everyone here in Baitabag," he said.

Baitabag is located along the North Coast Road near Alexishafen just 30 minutes from Madang.

It is located in a Rainforest with spectacular waterfalls. Trekking can be arranged by the local people to observe birdlife and share cultural activities.



Modilon General Hospital received a new 3d ultrasound machine on the 24th of November.

The head of the Obstetrics and Gynecology services at the general hospital, Dr John Bolnga, thanked the donors who recognized the need for such an ultrasound machine at Modilon Hospital in Madang.

"It was the kind realization of Lauren Tapper and Namiko Aleker who have had a strong association with Modilon Hospital and its staff, they saw that we had a need and managed to secure the ultrasound through various donors in Melbourne.

The donation was largely organized by Dr. Andrew Ngu, past president of ISUOG, based in Australia with General Electric (GE). Dr. Bolnga also acknowledged the kind assistance of Sir. Peter Barter and the Melanesian Foundation. He said that he was a blessing to the many people in the remote parts of Madang who will no Inger need to travel to Port Moresby and overseas to be diagnosed. Sir Peter paid K5500 for road freight from Melbourne to Cairns and then carried it aboard the Kalibobo Spirit from Cairns to Madang free of charge. Dr Bolnga said we are ever so grateful for his generosity. He has been a blessing to many people in the remote areas and the underprivileged, particularly women and children for many



years and he continues to do so," he said.

"It will serve the women of Madang well and we thank everyone for their part in securing it as well as ensuring that the machine arrived to us safely," he said.

PROJECT RECOVERY

A team called Project Recover, which was made up of marine scientists, archaeologists and volunteers, has finally found the WW2 bomber in Hansa Bay, off the coast of Madang.

The Bomber known as 'heaven can wait' was found with the assistance of MTS's Kalibobo Spirit and Niugini Diving Adventure's (NDA) Dallman Diver.

The co-founder of Project Recover, Eric Terrill, said that the whole purpose of the expedition was to find the 11 servicemen that were lost with the bomber.

"The results from our efforts in Hansa Bay have stirred a mix of lasting emotions within our team and drives home the need to recognize the sacrifices that service members and their families make in protecting our freedom," he said.

In Dec the US Navy arrived to remove the remains of the missing airmen and take them back to America to their families to Rest in Peace.


