Madang Community Commemorates ANZAC

"The freedom we enjoy in PNG today is the result from those who paid the ultimate sacrifice during WW2 which included Papua New Guineans as well as Australia and New Zealand," he said. "This also includes those who lost their life in Bougainville a conflict that should never have happened," said Sir. Peter.

He also gave tribute to Moses Werror, a former commander of the OPM in West Papua who passed away last week.

"He continued to fight for freedom in West Papua, such a freedom that we all enjoy in PNG."

The Coastwatchers Lighthouse has just been recently repainted and the floodlights restored by NMSA.

Sir Peter said that the local Youths should be praised.

"The real thanks should go to the Kalibobo Youths who maintained the area, stopped graffiti being drawn on the lighthouse and generally take good care of the Madang Icon on a voluntary basis."

Madang continues to attract the

largest number of people to its ANZAC ceremonies.

He also thanked the kind donations by the Madang business community.

"I would like to sincerely thank the business houses for supplying the food for the simple 'gun breakfast' that is traditionally held after the service."

He also said that it was disappointing to see the lack of support by the Madang Government.

"Sadly there was no involvement of the Provincial Government who ignore ANZAC as well as our own Remembrance Day on Jul 23," he said. "In reality, this should be combined with ANZAC to enable more people to remember those who have lost their lives in wars and conflicts and remind us of how futile it is to fight, lest we forget," said Sir. Peter.
